Under the guidance of Ambassador Susan Rice, Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy, the Domestic Policy Council (DPC) is tasked to bring "greater dignity, equity, opportunity, and prosperity to the everyday lives of Americans." The DPC coordinates across all branches of the Biden Administration to counter the effects of the pandemic, push economic recovery and social justice issues, and prepare U.S. society for global challenges such as climate change.
