Herman Mark Schwartz (Mark) is a professor in the Politics department of the University of Virginia. He is best known for work on the evolution of the global economy and the geo-politics of the subprime mortgage crisis, and has over a million published words. His current work looks at how changes in corporate strategy and structure towards seeking monopoly profit from intellectual property right deployed in vertically disaggregated production chains has contributed to slower global growth (i.e. 'secular stagnation'). He is the author of *In the Domains of Debt*, *States vs. Markets*, and *Subprime Nation: American Power, Global Capital, and the Housing Bubble*.
