Cyberborders: Managing Interdependence

in the Information Age

How do states border the internet, and how are these preferences related to globalization? In this lecture, Beth A. Simmons will talk about the use of "cyberborders", the focus on "digital authoritarianism", and why even liberal states might curb internet freedom.

Beth A. Simmons is the Andrea Mitchell University Professor in Law, Political Science and Business Ethics at the University of Pennsylvania Law School. She is a former Director of the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University and Clarence Dillon Professor of International Affairs at the Department of Government. She is best known for her research on the international political economy during the interwar years, policy diffusion globally, and her work demonstrating the influence that international law has on human rights outcomes around the world. She co-edited the Handbook of international relations (SAGE, 2012).

About SCRIPTS

The Cluster of Excellence "Contestations of the Liberal Script (SCRIPTS)" is a research consortium that analyses why the liberal model of order has fallen into crisis despite its political, economic, and social achievements. Interdisciplinary research teams investigate why alternative concepts of social order are on the rise, how these contestations differ from earlier contestation, and what the consequences are for the global challenges of our time. In operation since 2019, SCRIPTS is hosted by the Freie Universität Berlin and unites eight major Berlin-based research institutes.
